

Democratic Odyssey: Sortition Europe Democratic Lottery Report

Introduction

The Democratic Odyssey is a project organised by a group of 30 organisations led by the European University Institute's Florence School of Transnational Governance (EUI-STG) that will include citizens' assembly style meetings. This report outlines the details of our recruitment, by lottery, of a diverse group of 40 people from more than 15 European countries for the first Democratic Odyssey assembly to be held in Athens from September 27-29. A key element of the project was to document inventive ways of communicating the idea of democratic lotteries ("the pedagogy of sortition").

Sortition Europe Process

Sortition Europe used several steps to find a diverse sample, with the aim of recruiting 2 people from 20 European countries. Both steps mobilised our <u>SORT-EU network</u> of partner organisations from all over the EU and Bosnia-Herzegovina.

We firstly drew on a small existing reserve pool of people who had not been selected to participate in an earlier transnational deliberative event, but had expressed their interest in joining similar future events. These people had been originally contacted by randomly selecting locations in EU countries and knocking on doors at or near those locations.

To increase the diversity of those participating, our partner organisations supplemented this group in 6 European countries (Austria, Bulgaria, Germany, Lithuania, Malta, Spain and Bosnia-Herzegovina), inventing new ways of selecting addresses by lottery such as dice rolls, lottery draws, or dart throwing at a map!

Visiting and knocking on people's doors at those addresses, they talked to people about citizens' assemblies, the topic of the assembly in Athens, and how they can register online (or get help to register) if they would like to participate.

From these two techniques we then selected a diverse pool of 40 international participants from 20 different European countries, from a total pool of 99 people. The 40 people selected approximately reflect the diversity of the citizens living in Europe considering multiple demographic factors: their gender, age, education level and views on the EU. We overrepresented youth, but with such a small pool to draw from (due to financial constraints) it was impossible to meet some of the targets perfectly.


We then engaged in a phone confirmation and initial onboarding process to help the transition and handover of participants to the Democratic Odyssey team.

With this transnational group, as well as other participants from different groups, the Democratic Odyssey is embarking on a journey with a pilot assembly organised in Athens in September 2024.



Sortition Europe Invitation Letter



The Pedagogy of Sortition


As the Democratic Odyssey is a campaign to institutionalise sortition and deliberation at the EU level it is very important to convey the ideas of the assembly (including how the sortition process was conducted) to the wider public.
