Project details

The project "Social Investment in Germany" analyses recent welfare state reforms in Germany, their political underpinnings and economic impact. The successful candidate will be expected to work with scholars from different disciplines interested in the same issues, engage with scholars working on social investment at the EUI, and liaise with stakeholders in German policy making. For this position, we are looking for a post-doctoral researcher with significant expertise and experience in German political economy, the development of the German welfare state, recent developments in German political debates, in order to analyse policy reforms through the social investment framework, engage with stakeholders in German policy making, and formulate policy recommendation.

Job description

The research fellow will carry out research work in an independent manner and collaborate on the research work of the project. The research assistant will provide research assistance to the Project Director(s). Main tasks will include:

- Carrying out research, analysis and drafting of research output in the field of comparative politial economy, with a focus on German welfare state and social investment reforms
- Analysing social investment reforms and their impact through qualitative and quantitative research methods;
- Liaising with stakeholders in German policy making;
- Authoring and co-authoring papers and publications;
- Presenting research results and output at German as well as international conferences worldwide;
- Engaging and disseminating research findings among policy actors;

- PhD in Political Science, preferably with a focus on political economy.
