WeEqualize will address the intertwined implications of the gender revolution - including changing gender beliefs, rising labor market insecurity, and the increasing retreat from partnerships - in shaping social inequalities in work-family strategies among different-sex couples across 24 countries from the 1960s to nowadays. WeEqualize proposes a new theoretical framework to identify and disentangle the distinct and changing drivers of work-family strategies by couples' education and across 24 industrialized countries. This framework will identify barriers and solutions to gender inequality within partnerships. The research assistants will contribute to the aims of the project that employs and harmonizes time-diary data and longitudinal surveys as well as advanced statistics methods (e.g. latent-class analysis, relative density approach, demographic microsimulation methods, etc.).

The Research Assistants will provide research assistance to the Director of the project.

Main tasks include:

- Engaging in high-quality research within the scope of the project;
- Contributing to publishing articles in peer-reviewed journals in sociology, demography, and related disciplines;
- Participating in the academic life of the research unit.
