#### **Project details**

The Horizon RADAR consortium aims to understand how public administration reforms and innovations affect democratic legitimacy. The main objective of the project is to provide public administrations (in particular in central government) in democratic societies with tools to construct input, throughput and output legitimacy for public administration reform. It will do so through deep studying the potential for democratic anchorage of these reforms and through studying the legitimising accounts on the role and functioning of public administrations in democratic systems.

#### **Job description**

The research fellow will carry out research work in an independent manner and collaborate on the research work of the project. The research assistant will provide research assistance to the Project Director(s).

- Collecting data and performing sophisticated multi-level statistical analysis
  using the new European Quality of Government Index survey data and
  other data sources in view to, inter alia, examine relationships between
  citizens' attitudes towards public administration legitimacy and broader
  democratic attitudes and behaviors at national and regional levels;
- Conducting a systematic review of literatures on topics including democratic backsliding, populism, public administration reform, citizen participation, trust in government, illiberal democracy, and democratic innovation;
- Assisting in the coordination and conducting of a multiparty research project, including workshops and dissemination events;
- Preparing policy briefs that encapsulate key findings and implications, preparing and coordinating reports as well as deliverables in the frame of the project, and translating project outcomes into curricular and educational resources.
