## Introduction

Reflecting on the EU's Eastern enlargement at its twentieth anniversary is an opportunity to take stock of the workings of the enlarged Union, as well as on the prospects for and challenges of any future 'widening'. This opportunity could not be timelier in the context of a disrupted European and global security architecture, systemic fractures of democracy and the rule of law across the continent, and the need to address these interrelated issues in a new geopolitical context. Praised as a success in the context of the 2004/07/13 accessions, the EU's enlargement policy has largely been ineffective in the Western Balkans. In a context of high expectations for the policy to deliver on Ukraine, Moldova, and Georgia, this session explores questions that concern not only the preand post-accession experiences of the current members, but also the effects of the Eastern Enlargement on the enlargement policy, and the shape and the workings of the future Union.
