She was a Director of the Max Planck Project Group for 'Common Goods: Law, Politics, and Economics' in Bonn from 1999 to 2003. Before that, from 1995 to 1999, she held a chair in public policy at the EUI. She is a member of the Berlin Brandenburg Academy of Sciences and Humanities and a member of the Academia Europea.

Luiza Bialasiewicz | University of Amsterdam

Luiza Bialasiewicz is a political geographer and currently Professor of European Governance at the University of Amsterdam, where she also directs the Amsterdam Centre for European Studies (ACES). From September 2024, she will take up the post of Professor of Economic and Political Geography in the Department of Economics at Ca' Foscari, University of Venice.
